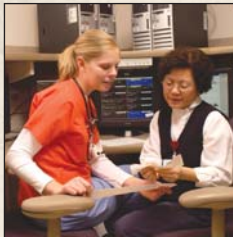


Cardiovascular & Cardiology

Step Down Telemetry Unit

Loyola University Health System, located 10 miles west of downtown Chicago, is a nationally recognized leader in providing specialty and primary health care services to its patients. Our 70-acre campus includes the Foster G. McGaw Hospital, ranked the #1 Heart Program in the State of Illinois by U.S. News & World Report for two consecutive years, a Level 1 Trauma Center, a regional Burn Center, the Cardinal Bernardin Cancer Center, the Ronald McDonald Children's Hospital, the Stritch School of Medicine and an Outpatient Center.



Nurses in this unit will have their skills challenged by both medical and surgical cardiology patients not typically seen in smaller suburban hospitals. These patients include: coronary artery bypass grafts, valve replacements, lung & heart transplants, cardiac catheterizations, electrophysiology and myocardial infarctions. Many patients are transported here when their situation becomes so critical that chances for a full recovery will only be possible through the treatment services available from a leader in medicine...Loyola.



Determining the most effective plan of care for our patients requires a collaborative approach between Physicians, Nurse Managers, Advanced Practice Nurses, Staff Nurses, Case Managers, Clinical Pharmacists, Staff Educators, Cardiac Rehab Specialists, Cardiac Monitor Technicians, Dietitians, Social Workers, Chaplains, Patient Care Technicians and Service Coordinators. Treatment programs include state-of-the-art medication management including advanced cardiac intravenous therapy and management of cardiac arrhythmias. Some patients require a multi-disciplinary approach to treating their illness which allows for a continuous learning environment. With a commitment to service excellence, this unit led the entire health system in patient satisfaction.

SHIFT SCHEDULES

Managers and schedule coordinators strive to accommodate the busy lifestyles of our nursing staff by creating work schedules that are flexible yet stable in order to maintain a healthy work-life balance. 12-hour shifts are available.

ORIENTATION

A ten-week orientation includes a one-week classroom education, two-week EKG class and an additional seven-week clinical orientation with one-on-one direct supervision of a preceptor.
