

Maternity/Newborn Unit



Loyola's 30-bed Maternity/Newborn Unit cares for OB/GYN, Maternal/Fetal Medicine and Urogynecology patients. We also boast a 25-bed nursery, with 8 special care beds, where RNs care for infants who require special attention.

Maternity Patients

Loyola RNs care for mother's experiencing many complications before delivery. These high-risk patients may include women with diabetes, preeclampsia, multiple gestation, premature labor, prolonged rupture of membranes, placenta abnormalities and renal complications.

Newborn Nursery

Many newborns are delivered without complications and receive routine care before being reunited with their mothers. Infants requiring special care include those who are born premature, require phototherapy due to jaundice, are hypoglycemic, experience apnea due to prematurity or reflux, or experience drug withdrawal. Mother's also receive "couplet care" where one of Loyola's RNs is specially assigned to care for mom and baby.

Post-Op Care

The Maternity/Newborn Unit also provides post-op care for women who have received a hysterectomy or uro-gyne repair.

Opportunities for RNs

Loyola offers self-scheduling with 12-hour shifts available and holiday/weekend rotations. Orientation is provided for 9-12 weeks with an assigned preceptor. Additionally, Loyola's Maternity/Newborn Unit encourages RNs to participate in unit committees which include patient satisfaction, employee recognition, and ongoing education.

Benefits Program

Loyola offers a competitive salary and benefits package which includes medical, dental, vision & life insurance, vacation accrual, ten paid holidays, paid personal, sick & bonus days, a pension plan, a matched retirement savings plan, a nursing clinical ladder program, an on-site fitness center, and tuition assistance benefits at Loyola University Chicago. Part-time staff hired for a minimum of 20 hours/week are eligible for many of the same benefits on a pro-rated basis.
