Loyola University Health System is one of Chicago's most well-respected hospitals and is recognized nationally for excellence in patient care, education and research. Our 70-acre campus, planned for future hospital expansion, includes the Foster G. McGaw Hospital, a Level 1 Trauma Center, a regional Burn Center, the Cardinal Bernardin Cancer Center, a Level 3 NICU, the Ronald McDonald® Children's Hospital, the Stritch School of Medicine, and a state-of-the-art Outpatient Center.

Loyola's pharmacy services also extend throughout the continuum to our multiple ambulatory facilities located in the suburbs, Home Care & Hospice and the Cardinal Bernardin Cancer Center.

The complexity and diversity of our patients will challenge pharmacists to use their medical expertise in an academic setting providing direct patient care.

CONTEMPORARY PRACTICE

Loyola's vision for the future is being realized through the creation of a decentralized pharmacy model which allows for teams of Patient Care Pharmacists and Pharmacy

Techs to develop their expertise within specific service lines. These teams will focus on patient care while building relationships with physicians and nurses within the unit. Specialty satellite locations are also offered, such as the Pediatric/NICU pharmacy satellite which focuses on a specific patient population. Patient Care Pharmacists will be responsible for medication management; specifically evaluating the appropriateness of therapy, coordinating IV therapy, medication order verification, and other patient care services such as IV to PO therapy and pharmacokinetic dosing. Pharmacists who have completed their general practice residency are preferred.

Clinical Pharmacists are embedded within all service lines and round with physicians, educate residents and participate in programs associated with the Stritch School of Medicine.

Service lines include: anticoagulation, burn, cardiovascular, infectious disease, neonatal, neurology, oncology, pediatrics, transplant and trauma.

TECHNOLOGY AND AUTOMATION

The main hospital is zoned for wireless technology. This technology allows pharmacy techs to utilize Loyola's PIXIS automation technology from their laptop computer to process medication order verification and IV needs assessments while ensuring medication arrives to the unit promptly. Moving beyond traditional pharmacy services, Loyola's technology also includes an EPIC information system, automated dispensing cabinets, bar coded inventories, computer-controlled compounding pumps for nutrition and automated packaging equipment.

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

As an academic facility, Loyola provides ongoing education so pharmacists can build expertise, broaden their skills and advance their careers. Pharmacists will attend various seminars and are encouraged to attend local and national conferences.

The planned development of a hospital residency program affiliated with the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists and our close affiliations with various pharmacy schools in the Midwest has created opportunities for clinical and patient care pharmacists to make an impact on students during their introduction to pharmacy practice.
